

This weekend, we kick-off Catholic Schools Week at St. Mary and Trinity.

That being said, academics do not take a back seat in the learning process. Instead, we believe developing the intellectual aptitudes God has given us is the best way to grow in holiness.

However, Catholic Schools also understand that the way a person chooses to exercise his or her knowledge is far more important than having knowledge itself. Therefore, we support character development, instilling in children ethical values that ultimately guide their decision-making process; from their personal, everyday behaviors to their chosen career paths. 



Why do we take a week to celebrate Catholic schools? At SMWS and THS, we put God first in everything we do. We begin each morning with prayer, we pray before lunch, we pray at end the day, and our teachers incorporate prayer in their classes throughout the day. Each class also participates in retreats or prayer days, attends Mass weekly, and offers Reconciliation each semester. Twenty-four years ago, I was struggling a bit in my first year of teaching. My mom gave me sound advice when I did not want to hear it. I was sharing with her some struggles I was having with a particular student when my mom asked me one simple question: "Have you prayed for her?" I remember thinking, "No, mom, I am praying for myself." I did listen, however, and began to pray for her, and we ended up with the most positive teacher-student relationship before the year's end. I think God changed my way of responding to her and changed my heart to see her good qualities. I already loved all my students because that is what I decided I would do before I began a career in education, but from that moment on, I decided I would find something I liked about every student. I believe in my heart that is why, even in my 24th year in education, I am still excited to come to school! Teaching takes great love, forgiveness, determination, grit, and heart. Our teachers at SMWS and THS absolutely love their students and work diligently to help each student strive to be his or her best. Pope Francis said, "Teaching is a beautiful job; as it allows you to see the growth day by day of people entrusted to your care." I would like to thank this community for your support of our Catholic schools and for allowing me to work in such a rewarding vocation. Without your love and support, our schools would not exist, making it much more difficult to build future leaders of our church and community. It takes all of us to continue the 145 years of Catholic school education that is needed now more than ever in our world. Thank you, and please continue to pray for the students and teachers at St. Mary of the Woods School and Trinity High School.

Stewardship Bulletin Reflection | January 28, 2024 | Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time


DT 18:15-20; PS 95:1-2, 6-7, 7-9; 1 COR 7:32-35; MK 1:21-28

Our readings today remind us of God's authority.

As we reflect on our Gospel, we recognize that God possesses all authority and that we want to give Him all authority. Jesus was teaching in the synagogue on the Sabbath. All were fixed on His words and astonished at what He had to say. Suddenly everyone's attention shifted to a man with an unclean spirit who began to question Jesus and His authority. Jesus responded, "Quiet, come out of him!" and removed the evil spirit from the man. All were amazed at the healing of this man.

Life can sometimes look like the synagogue in Capernaum. We are living as disciples of Christ when we suddenly recognize evil around us — through events in our lives, temptations we are enduring, or by falling into sin. It can distract us, consume our attention, or even cause us to despair. In these moments of trial, we must remember the Healer in our Gospel today. Recall His words, "Quiet, come out of Him!" Jesus has the power and authority over evil, for He has conquered sin and death. He also has the power and authority over us. And when we invite Him to have that authority, He will heal us and help us persevere.

Today, we are reminded that God is in control and that we want Him to be in control. He is the loving Healer Who will work miracles in our lives if we give Him the authority to do so.
