Stewardship Bulletin Reflection March 24, 2024 | Palm Sunday of the Passion of the Lord IS 50:4-7; PS 22:8-9, 17-18, 19-20, 23-24; PHIL 2:6-11; MK 14:1-15:47



Today we celebrate Palm Sunday. As we read about the climax of Christ's mission here on earth, we are reminded that He is the Perfect Steward, a model for us all on our stewardship journey.

Our First Reading, from the prophet Isaiah, portrays a suffering servant. The suffering servant, in many ways, foreshadows what Jesus endured during His passion. Even though He didn't deserve such tortures, He humbly submitted to them. His mission as a steward was to fulfill His Father's mission. We, too, play a unique role in our Father's mission by bringing souls to Christ. It simply begins with the witness of our lives.

Today's Gospel shares the account of Jesus' last days on earth, and how He lives them says a great deal about how we should be living ours as faithful stewards. Jesus does many things in these last days, and they all revolve around prayer and service — two trademark actions of a good and faithful Catholic. He hosts a Passover meal in which He gives us His Body and Blood in the Eucharist. He intensely prays to His Father. Lastly, He submits to humiliation, torture and death for our sake, calling out to God the Father in His weakest moments. We might not be called to the same type of prayer and service, but we are all called to commit time in daily prayer with our Lord, and to serve our families, churches and neighbors.

As we embark on this Holy week, let us take some time to reflect on the life of Christ as He is our model Steward, and may we strive to imitate Him daily.

St. Mary's Cemetery Guidelines

The following guidelines were established to aid in maintaining a clean and beautiful resting place for our departed loved ones. Any funds collected are used for maintaining the property but also for future expansion and planning. Your help and cooperation is required.

- 1. Burial Rights: The buyer purchases burial rights only, not a deed or conveyance of any title or interest in the land. Unwanted graves may only be sold back to St. Mary's Cemetery, and at no more than the original purchase price. Graves may be transferred from one person to another, but must be done through the Church office so that accurate records are maintained.
- 2. Payment for graves may be spread over 2 years. 20% of the total cost is due at the time of purchase. If no payment has been received within 2 years from the date of purchase, the graves revert back to the Church. If partial payment has been received at the end of the 2year period, the remainder must be paid or graves revert back to the Church and payment received to that date will be refunded.
- 3. Membership in the Cemetery Association is open to St. Mary parishioners only and pays for part of the opening and closing of a grave. Membership will be lost if dues become delinquent for one year. Dues are subject to increase to keep abreast of expenses. Presently membership dues are \$25 per year.
- 4. Containers: Vaults shall be of a permanent type concrete or at least 20 gauge galvanized steel. Vaults are not required for urns used in cremation.
- 5. Foundations for monuments shall be a minimum of 20 inches deep. The parish office must be contacted before monuments are erected. Military marker foundations must be at least 12 inches.
- 6. Glass jars, tin cans, tin vases, or any type of crockery vase or urn is not permitted at any grave in the cemetery. These will be removed as they are dangerous and can also damage equipment.
- 7. Nothing may be planted in the cemetery. Potted plants should not be put in the ground, but only stood at the grave. This is also true of baskets. These things may be removed.
- 8. Do not construct any type of permanent fixture such as those made of rocks, brick, stone, wood, or poles of any sort around the monument. Anything that obstructs or detracts from the peaceful ambience of the grounds will be removed. These things can also make mowing and trimming extremely difficult. Shepherd hooks are permitted.
- 9. Artificial flowers on a stand are not permitted from April 1st October 31st. Please do not bring them to the cemetery. They will be removed as the grass is cut. The exception is those that clip to the monument and do not interfere with mowing.
- Cemetery gates will be locked from dusk to dawn Sunday through Saturday. Gates will remain locked during inclement weather.

Please help keep our cemetery a beautiful place of reverence and simplicity.
